State Parliament and Government House



Lastly they walked across to Government House, which is where the SA Governor General signs off on new laws.

SafeWork SA

Risk factors for young workers

Jason Mavrikis from SafeWorkSA presented to Senior School students on Work, Health & Safety Issues for young workers. Young workers are overrepresented in injury statistics relating to



work places. The six highest risk factors are: Inadequate supervision and training, lack of of responsibilities, awareness rights and inexperience in the job and/or workplace, high incidence of mental health issues, being bullied or facing peer pressure and reluctance to speak up about problems. Jason described an incident where a 15-year-old worker fell into tray of hot oil at KFC. This was impactful given that many young workers work in the fast food industry. It was found that the employer had failed in a number of areas A business is responsible, where reasonably practicable, to eliminate or reduce risks in the workplace. Workers are also responsible to take reasonable care. Jason reminded students that they can contact SafeWork SA with any questions or concerns.

Career choices

Australian Defence Force presentation

Warrant Officer Class Two Kym O'Leary spoke to senior students about a wide range opportunities available in the Army, Navy or Air Force. General or Officer entry each have different eligibility requirements. Those seeking a part time role in the Defence Force could consider the Army Reserves which offer the most variety of available positions. To join you must be an Australian citizen, minimum age 16.5 years, have passed Math and English and be reasonably fit. More specific details are available on the Defence Force website. There are numerous benefits of joining the Defence Force including having a stimulating and rewarding career, free training, good accommodation and food, health services and free gym access. An opportunity exists to experience Defence Force life without long term commitment by undertaking the Defence Force Gap Year where you spend an exciting 12-months in the Navy, Army or Air Force.
