

About the fundraiser Bailey said, "On the day the lines were packed and there were people left right and centre. It was a struggle to run back and forward getting things and serving. But we got it done. It was very fun. When we left for the trip to Hutt Street we struggled to get everything in. When we got there it was so fun listening to all the things that we did and how we helped all the people. In my opinion it was amazing. I loved it."

Anika said, "We had such a fun time seeing the wonderful building that has helped so many homeless people back onto their feet. We got the wonderful opportunity to meet Becky, one of the volunteers there who told us some upsetting and surprising facts about homelessness. One thing that surprised me the most was that at least 20% of homeless people actually have been to university and have a bachelor's degree. This helped me to understand that anyone can experience homelessness no matter who they are or what their background is ."

Mikala said, "I am glad that we went to Hutt St. to donate the money and items we collected as a school community. It was interesting to see how easily we could help people with just a few essentials. The Hutt St. Centre was nice and the workers were grateful for the donations that we made. Overall, I learnt much about how easily we can help people and learnt it first-hand that a few daily items can help improve someone's life."

Charlotte R said, "It was such an eye opening experience that was truly inspiring. Just looking at all the volunteers giving up their time was truly special. You could see that all our supplies and money would be put to great use. A bag was even offered to someone as soon as we stepped inside and was gladly received. After meeting with one of the main employers. Just listening to all the stats behind people experiencing homelessness, made me want to help in any way I could. I have thoroughly enjoyed the day and have learnt so much!"

Career planning


Students are encouraged to take part in University open days where they can find out about institutions' courses and programs, explore campus facilities and speak with current students. This year, many institutions are offering a virtual
