
Droning on...

DIGITAL TECHNOLOGIES



Digital Technologies is growing in scope and ambition at Hope Christian College.

The College has recently acquired a suite of CoDrone Pro micro drones. Over the last week a Year 8 class had the chance to build the remotes for these drones and then fly them for the first time in Term 3. Students worked in groups of two or three. They set up the remotes and drones, calibrated and then flew them. The aim of the lesson was to perform a controlled take off, fly a few metres and land on a small helipad.
